### **At the building site -**

- ✓ Paving has been completed and we are anticipating the final painting of the parking lines.
- ✓ All concrete has been poured.
- ✓ All masonry work has been completed.
- ✓ The miscellaneous steel for hand rails is on site, and some is already installed.
- ✓ All rough carpentry projects are complete.
- ✓ Finish carpentry is in process.
- ✓ Dry walling, taping and sanding are proceeding.
- ✓ The roof membrane has been installed, with the exception of the area with metal roofing.
- ✓ Aluminum work has commenced on the entrance areas.
- ✓ Painting has started, the atrium ceiling is completed, and the first coat on the sanctuary ceiling is completed.
- ✓ Landscaping has progressed through the last month and will be completed in the next week or so.
